

GEORGIA, PACED BY TRIPPI, WINS OVER TECH, 35-7

Athens, Ga., Nov. (AP).—Charlie Trippi defeated Georgia Tech today, 35 to 7, with some occasional help from his Georgia teammates to earn the Bulldogs the right to play in the Sugar bowl game. Trippi thrilled the capacity crowd of 55,000 with three touchdowns, one on a 66 yard dash. He also threw a touchdown pass to Johnny Rauch.

The victory gave Georgia its first perfect season since 1896, when Pop Warner steered it thru four games.

Trippi Starts Rolling

Trippi and Rauch completed 15 of 21 passes, two of Rauch's being for touchdowns. Tech completed nine of 19. Georgia made 263 yards rushing and 168 passing, while Tech netted 169 on the ground and 115 on passes.

Near the end of the first period Trippi and Charlie Smith alternated to pick up two first downs and then Trippi, apparently trapped at mid-field for a big loss, rifled a throw to Joe Tereshinski at the Tech 8. After a penalty put the ball back on the 20 John Rauch passed to Dan Edwards at the 8. On fourth down Trippi bulled over from the 4, completing an 80 yard drive. After Georgia had recovered a Tech fumble following the kick-off, Trippi passed to Reid Moseley at the 34 and to Rauch at the 17. He then hit Rauch with an 8 yard pass for the second score, and George Jernigan's placement gave the Bulldogs a 14 to 0 lead at the half.

He Does It Again

Early in the third quarter Trippi intercepted a pass and ran 17 yards to the Tech 29, from where the Bulldogs drove to their third touchdown, Trippi taking a 10 yard pass from Rauch for the score. Near the end of the period, the Bulldogs started an 82 yard scoring march which was climaxed in the final quarter on a 9 yard pass, Rauch to Smith. A 35 yard pass, Rauch to Edwards, had carried the ball to the Tech 17. Jernigan kicked both points again.

With a few minutes left, Trippi broke away for 66 yards for the final touchdown.
