

**R. C. WATSON, FORMER  
PRESIDENT U. S. G. A.,  
DIES**

When Robert C. Watson passed away at his Englewood home not long ago after an illness of three years golf in this country lost one of its staunchest supporters. Mr. Watson was president of the United States Golf Association for two terms, about a dozen years ago, after having held the post of secretary for four years. As a golfer he began his career in 1898, when he was graduated from St. Mark's School, and in the course of time he ranked among the best of the American amateurs. He was more than a golfer, however; he was at the forefront in a variety of sports in his youth. At St. Mark's he captained the football and baseball teams and he excelled also in boxing and hockey.
