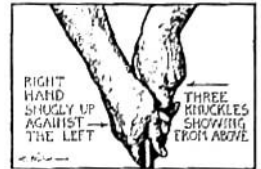


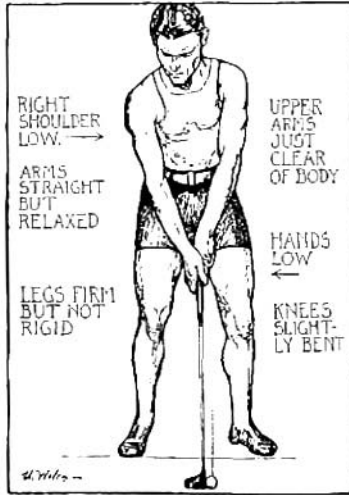
Elements of the Golf Swing

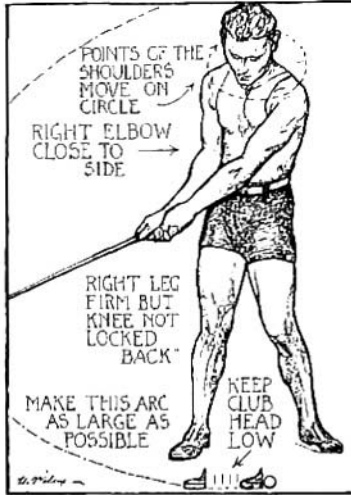

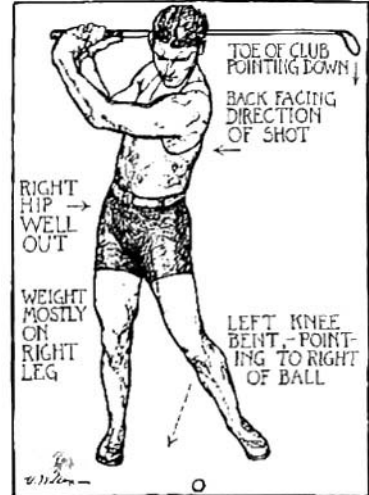

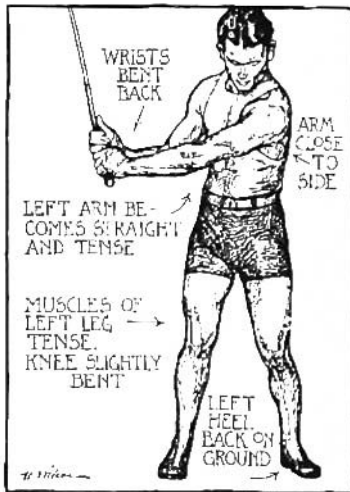
STANCE



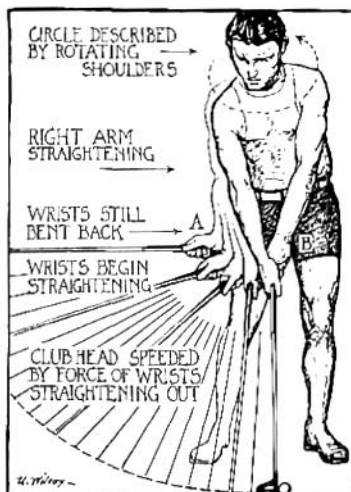
BACK SWING—PIVOT



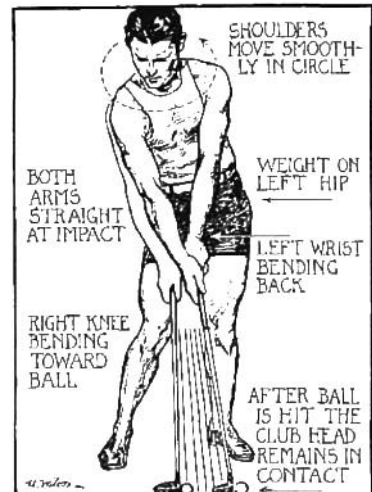
TOP OF THE SWING



THE DOWN SWING



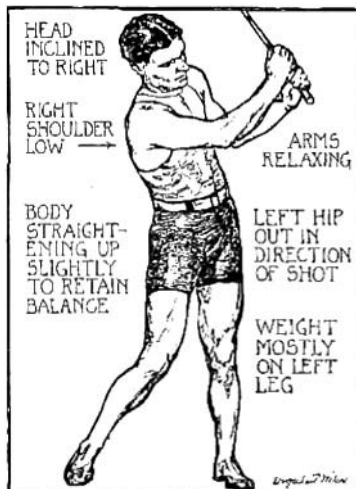
HITTING THE BALL



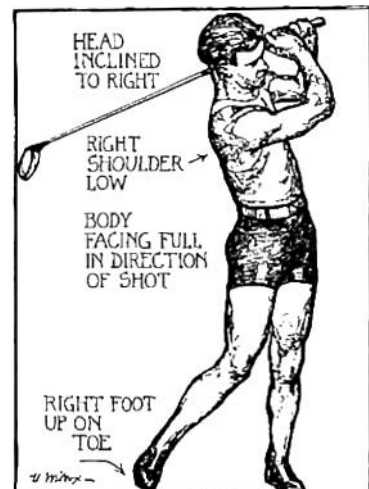
GRIPPING THE BALL
