

### New Courses

A group of men in Lena, Ill., have chipped in \$100 each and bought 40 acres of land on the edge of the town from William Rote for a golf course. Work is to be started on the course at once.

The Navajo Fields Golf Club, Burr Oak Avenue at 127th Street, Chicago, has purchased 147 acres of land for a course and fine club house. Christian Krueger is president.

The University of Michigan has purchased 30 acres of land south of Ferry Field at Ann Arbor for a golf course. The tract has been used for a private course.

Brae Loch Golf and Sports Club will soon make its appearance near Waukegan, Ill. The club will be situated four miles north of Libertyville and a mile east of Grayslake, on Gage's Lake. Stirling B. McDonald of S. Karpen & Brothers, is the owner.

The South Side Civic Association of Columbus, Ohio, has asked for a golf course for the residents of that district.

The idea has been discussed of establishing the Miami golf course, to include parts of the Fisher Hall grounds, lower athletic field, and a portion of the Bishop pasture at the Miami University, Oxford, Ohio.

Brookston, Indiana, after several unsuccessful attempts, is to have a country club and golf course. A long subscription list has been signed. It is headed by W. J. Emerson.

Reports from Monticello, Indiana, say that Joe Ingersoll of Chicago, and seven associates, will build a hotel and golf course on the Vanus Cowin farm of 400 acres at Tiogo, Ind.

The Irvanna Golf Club has been organized with a membership of 110 at Irvine, Kentucky. Dr. O. F. Hume has been elected president.
