MESSAGE FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

Again ISOH wishes to congratulate two of its members who were awarded the Olympic Order in silver by the Council of the Olympic Order, which convened just before the Olympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City. The two ISOH members are Treasurer David Wallechinsky (USA), and the former President of the World Olympians Association and Olympic waterpolo player, Peter Montgomery (AUS). We congratulate both David and Peter with this great and well deserved honour.

Just before closure of the deadline for this issue, Bill Mallon informed me about the passing in December 2001 of our ISOH-member Dick Schaap. With his family, we mourn the death of a good Olympic historian, who through his books, left an undelible legacy. Bill Mallon wrote Dick Schaap's obituary, which you will find in this issue.

On March 6, 2002, I received a letter from Fékrou Kidane, Director of the Executive Office of the President of the IOC and representative of the IOC in the Executive Committee of the ISOH, informing the ISOH Executive.

PAYMENT BY VISA

Over the last few years, several ISOH Members have inquired about paying their dues with VISA or some other credit card. This problem relates to the difficulty for some of our international members not having access to the proper currencies or being charged exorbitant fees to obtain different currencies. We have discussed this situation at several Executive Committee Meetings.

At the moment, the bottom-line answer is that we are not able to accept credit card payments and cannot in good faith put this into practice at the moment. I have thoroughly investigated this several times and in 2001, after our May Executive Committee Meeting, was charged with trying to find a way to work out credit card payments.

The problem is that we have 300 members, of which only a few (probably less than 100), would pay via credit card each year. Fees to set up this service, and for each transaction, would end up costing as much as our annual dues. Effectively, we would be receiving no money for dues from the members because of the credit card transaction fees. Although we are solvent financially, after I presented this information to the Executive Committee last summer, we unanimously agreed this was not a wise financial decision for ISOH and we elected not to proceed with credit card payments at this time. It is possible that should our membership increase or another method of payment via credit be found, that we may re-visit the situation in the future.
