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The year 1985 marks the 100th anniversary of the AAHPERD. As part of the centennial celebrations, a special issue of the *Research Quarterly for Exercise and Sport* which will focus upon the *historical development* of our professional field has been planned. The Editorial Committee is desirous of achieving an issue which reflects the scope of the Alliance (health, physical education, recreation, dance, safety, athletic sport, the discipline, etc.), and will consider manuscripts in any or all such areas. Particular, but not exclusive, emphasis is to be given to events which have been of consequence to the professional organization itself.

The Editorial Committee is committed to an issue which contains historical research of the highest quality, and scholars who intend to submit manuscripts for consideration should be guided by the criteria and standards currently in use by the *RQES*. Historical studies must give proper attention to objectivity, thoroughness, sound logic, analysis, synthesis and interpretation. Where appropriate, events in the field should be related to broader social, cultural and/or intellectual contexts (see: "Research Quarterly Evaluative Criteria," *Research Quarterly*, 47:4, p. 879). Manuscripts must conform to the University of Chicago Manual of Style, 12th edition. In general, manuscripts should not exceed 24 pages.

It is anticipated that the reviewing process and other technical matters will proceed in a manner similar to that outlined in the "Guide for Contributors to Research Quarterly for Exercise and Sport"; see volume 52:1, pp. 136-139. Authors whose manuscripts are accepted will *not* be assigned page charges.

To be considered, manuscripts for the 100th Anniversary Issue of the *RQES* must be directed to the Editor and postmarked no later than January 2, 1984. All inquiries concerning the issue should be directed to the Editor.
