### *GRADUATE STUDENT ESSAY CONTEST*

NASSH announces its fourth Annual Graduate Student Essay contest. A NASSH Scholarship will be given the author of a student paper chosen by a panel of judges. The best essay will be read by the author at the 1988 Convention, held at Arizona State University, Tempe, Arizona, in May. Expenses (round-trip economy airfare within North America, accommodations, meals, convention registration) for the conference and membership in NASSH for 1988 will be paid to the winner. Requirements: Candidates are required to submit by January 1, 1988 four copies of a 3,000-4,000 word essay in sport history (double spaced with end notes) to: Prof. Richard Crepeau, Dept. of History, University of Central Florida, P.O. Box 25000, Orlando, Florida, 32816. The Journal of Sport History reserves the right of first refusal for possible publication. The 1987 prize winner was Jim Coates, University of Maryland, College Park, for his essay "Racial Segregation of the Baltimore Parks System, 1890-1917."
