NORTH AMERICAN SOCIETY FOR SPORT HISTORY NASSH GRADUATE ESSAY PRIZE

The North American Society for Sport History announces its seventh annual "NASSH Graduate Essay Prize." The NASSH Prize will be given for the essay which a panel of judges deems of highest quality. The student whose essay is chosen shall present the paper at the 1991 Convention, held at Loyola University, Chicago, Illinois, May 25-28, 1991. Expenses will be paid by NASSH.

Eligibility

1. Any student who is doing graduate work during the 1990-91 year, including both masters and doctoral students.
2. Previous winners are not eligible.

Award

1. Economy airfare and return from a site in North America to the 19th Annual NASSH Convention at Loyola University, Chicago, Illinois, May 25-28, 1991.
2. Accommodations and meals at the convention.
3. Convention registration.
4. Membership in NASSH for 1991

Requirements

1. Candidates are to submit, by January 1, 1991, four copies of a 3,000-4,000 word sport history essay. For examples of suitable topics and format, see articles in the *Journal of Sport History*. These are submitted to:

2. The research and writing are to be undertaken by the student. The essay must be double spaced and with notes collected at the end.
3. The writer shall attend the convention and present the paper.
4. The winning essay shall be sent to the *Journal of Sport History* for review and possible publication.

To promote and honor outstanding research and writing, the North American Society for Sport History offers the annual NASSH Book Award in Sport History. The award is given for a distinguished book in English on any aspect of sport history, without chronological or geographic restriction, carrying a cash prize of \$500 and commemorative certificate for the author.

Books published during the calendar year 1990 are eligible for the award. Biographies, monographs, and works of synthesis and interpretation are eligible. Anthologies, texts, translations, and collections of documents will not be considered. NASSH will announce the award recipient in May at its annual meeting.
