In 1979 the South African government announced an 'autonomous sports' policy which enabled sporting organisations to administer their own affairs. The policy was an attempt to depoliticise sport for the benefit of local and international critics and to co-opt specific groups of urban blacks to nullify their political demands. Provides a detailed examination of sporting organisations in South Africa. The policy has not freed sport from the apartheid ideology and practices that exist in South Africa. Mainly primary sources; 61 notes.
