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# Editor's Comments

It is customary for editors of academic journals to encourage the submission of manuscripts through periodic announcements to colleagues at national conferences and by other forms of communication. I am no different. Although I am generally pleased with the flow of manuscripts and overall quality of submissions, I believe it is incumbent upon me to continue to encourage scholars, those just beginning their careers and those more established, to consider the journal as an outlet for their research. There are certain topics in particular, and I believe I mentioned this in Windsor, that have seemingly never been well represented in the journal. These include winter sports, early professional football and basketball, cycling, soccer, and golf, just to name a few. I know full well, of course, that this is not necessarily a result of a lack of interest in the journal, but a reflection of the limited number of scholars actively researching these topics and the increasing number of publishing outlets now available.

I have chosen to republish Stephen Norwood's review of Kenneth Jennings' book, *Swings and Misses: Moribund Labor Relations in Professional Baseball*, which appeared in the last issue of the journal. Through no fault of Professor Norwood, several errors in the review altered the very meanings of sentences and the overall assessment of the book. My apologies to both Professor Norwood and Mr. Jennings for the mistakes that went undetected prior to publication.

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
