Membership Committee Report

The Membership Committee of 1973-75 has focused its efforts primarily on securing lists of potential members and providing these to the Secretary-Treasurer for mailing. Much of this work was completed in 1973-74; in 1974-75, the recommendation to check on the possibility of high school subscriptions to *The Journal of Sport History* has been pursued. Several letters have been sent to a sampling of high schools in Illinois, Minnesota, and Wisconsin and follow-up information will be sent pending responses to that mailing.

Further responsibilities include development of an Operating Code detailing the functions of the Membership Committee, Recommendations for future responsibilities of this committee:

1. Pending response from the sampling of high schools, a large-scale mailing to high schools throughout the United States and Canada should be considered.
2. NASSH Council should, perhaps, discuss the function of this committee. It seems that after the initial efforts of beginning a new organization, the need for a Membership Committee takes on a different perspective. A more feasible plan might be a membership chairman who worked closely with the Secretary-Treasurer, since all mailings generally emanate from that office.
