COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

May 25, 1978

The meeting of the Council of the North American Society for Sport History was called to order by President Max Howell at 8: 15 a.m. on May 25, 1978 in the cafeteria of the Adult Education Center of the University of Maryland. College Park.

Present were: Bruce Bennett, Max Howell, Donald Mrozek, Ron Smith, and Paula Welch. Non-Council member Mary Lou LeCompte, 1979 convention manager, was present.

It was decided to accept the Publications Board recommendation that back issues of the Journal of Sport History and the annual Proceedings remain at \$5.00 each.

The Council agreed with the Publications Board not to publish full papers in the annual Proceedings as it would likely detract from the Journal of Sport History.

The Journal of Sport History would remain at three issues per year, and it would revert to two issues only if necessary.

The Council agreed that a Directory of Scholars in Sport History should be done by the Publications Board.

The Council agreed to allow the Editor of the Journal to appoint an advertising representative.

The Council agreed to not allow Marathon Press and ERIC to reproduce Journal articles, but only to allow indexing. It suggested getting a legal opinion on reproducing articles under the new copyright law.

Don Mrozek reported that Arne Richards of Kansas State University would be willing to become the NASSH historian.

The vote of May 23, 1978 meeting concerning the 1981 convention site was reconsidered following the receipt of a letter from Mary Keyes of May 18, 1978, from McMaster University. A discussion of McMaster University as the proposed 1981 convention site, as first proposed, ensued. There was a question of the cost of convention meeting rooms at McMaster; of three western sites in a row if Kansas State University were accepted for 1981; of two Canadian sites in succession if McMaster were chosen.

It was MOVED (Bruce Bennett) and seconded to recommend to the Business meeting that the convention sites be McMaster University in 1981 and Kansas State University in 1982. The Council further reserves the right to reconsider future convention sites depending upon the projected costs to NASSH and its membership. PASSED (unanimously).

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 a.m.
