
R. Tait McKenzie Symposium on Sport

The second R. Tait McKenzie Symposium on Sport is being sponsored by the Department of Physical Education at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, May 3-4, 1979. The McKenzie Symposium, in honor of the noted sculptor, medical doctor, and physical educator of the early decades of the 20th century, is devoted to the humanistic understanding of sport. The symposium uses the broad base of humanities- linguistics, religious studies, jurisprudence, history, philosophy, and the fine arts- to look at the phenomenon of sport. The University of Tennessee, Knoxville, is the site of the R. Tait McKenzie Museum which houses the extensive Joseph B. Wolffe collection of McKenzie works. Deadline for submission of detailed abstracts or preferably completed manuscripts is February 9, 1979.
