2. Four non-returnable copies of each manuscript must be submitted to **either** Editor. The review process is anonymous; therefore, names of authors and their institutional affiliation should appear only on the title/cover page. Care should also be taken to ensure, where reasonable, that the author is not identified in the text of the paper.
3. Manuscripts must be submitted in English. Authors should follow the reference, footnote and bibliographical format utilized in the latest volume of *Olympika*. Additional information may be derived from the most recent edition of *The Chicago Manual of Style*. Manuscripts employing different formats will be accepted for initial review. However, acceptance for publication will depend upon appropriate stylistic revisions to be conducted by the authors before final publication. More complete style and format instructions will accompany notices of acceptance.
4. Three copies of the final revised version of all accepted papers, as well as a copy of the word processor disk from which they are derived, are required before publication. Specific computer format information will be sent to the author upon acceptance. Authors are responsible for obtaining copyright permission, when applicable, for all items and material utilized in the submitted manuscripts before publication.
5. It is expected that the review process will be normally completed within eight to ten weeks from the date of receipt of submissions by the Editors.
6. All submissions should be accompanied by four copies of an abstract of no more than 150-200 words. This abstract should be typed on a separate page containing only the title of the article and the abstract itself, no names or any other identifying information should be included.
