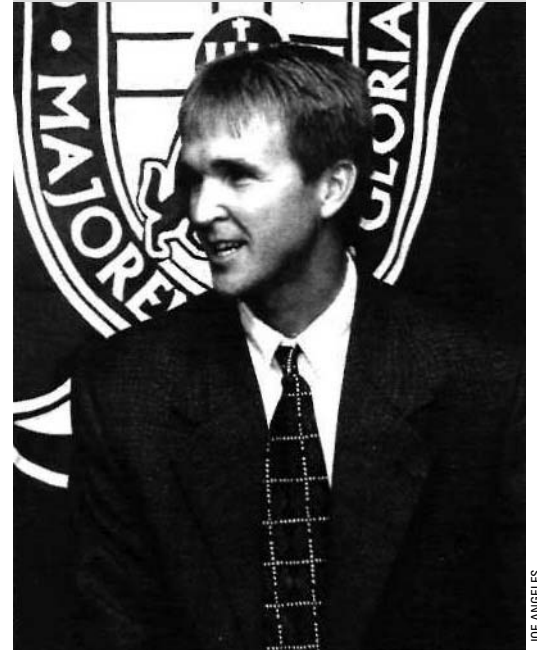


College Roundup

MIDWEST MOVES: Bobby Clark's decision to leave Stanford for the Notre Dame men's head-coaching job set off coaching changes at two Midwestern powers.

Two months after leading Creighton to the NCAA Division I final, Bret Simon took the Stanford position. Bob Warming then left Saint Louis to return to Creighton, which he had built into a national power in the early 1990s.



Dan Donigan is only the fifth head coach in Saint Louis University history.

Warming's replacement is SLU assistant Dan Donigan.

Donigan joined the Billikens staff in 1997 after three seasons as an assistant at Connecticut, where he was a three-time All-American.

O'LEARY AT GMU: Irishman Fran O'Leary takes over at George Mason following the retirement of Gordon Bradley.

O'Leary, 38, coached the past seven seasons at Dartmouth, where he replaced Clark.

LEONE HEADS WEST: Ray Leone, who led Clemson to its first ACC women's regular-season title in 2000, has left the Tigers to take over the Arizona State program.

Leone took over the Tiger program when his wife, Tracey, left to work with the U.S. women's national team program.

Clemson reached the NCAA Division I quarterfinals three of the past four years.

WUSA VACANCIES: The three women's programs that lost head coaches to the WUSA have filled their vacancies.

Penn State promoted assistant Paula Wilkins to replace Pat Farmer (New York Power). Swede Ewa Bergsten succeeds Mark Krikorian (Philadelphia Charge) at Hartford, where she was an assistant the past three years. Northwestern hired Missouri assistant Jenny Haigh after the departure of Marcia McDermott (Carolina Courage).
