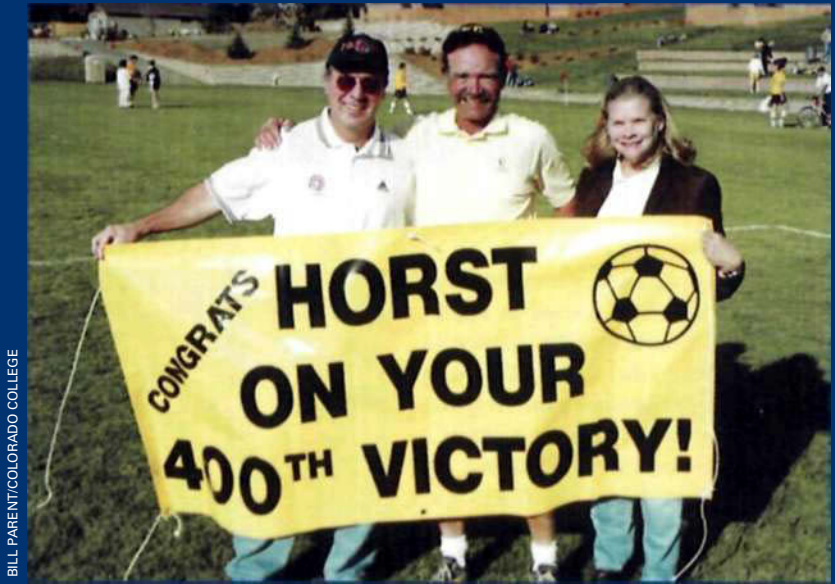

- Virginia finished up the ACC men's regular season with a 3-0 win over Maryland to finish with a 6-0-0 record, its first perfect season since 1986. All six wins this season were shutouts.

- Defending champion Connecticut's rise in the Soccer America Top 20 coincided with the arrival of Jamaican international **Shavar Thomas**. The Huskies went 9-1-0 and allowed only four goals in the 6-foot-1 defender's first 10 games. Six of the wins came by one goal. UConn has struggled to find the nets since striker **Cesar Cuellar** went down with a torn ACL in early September.

- The most prolific scorer in college soccer history, men or women, is **Juliana Filipe**, who has netted 144 goals in 79 games for NAIA power Union (Ky.). Filipe, a senior forward from Brazil, also holds the collegiate points record with 328. She's topped 30 goals in each of her four seasons: 31, 34, 34 and, this year, 45.

- Colorado College's **Horst Richardson** became just the fourth NCAA Division III men's coach to reach the 400-victory plateau when the Tigers defeated MacMurray, 4-1. Richardson, a member of CC's German department since 1965, joined **Joe Bean** of Wheaton (Ill.) College, **Jay Martin** of

Ohio Wesleyan and **Dan Gilmore** of Rowan in the D3 400 club.

- Christian Brothers forward **Missy Gregg**'s scoring feats continue to amaze. The former Dayton All-American scored five goals as the Lady Bucs' captured the Gulf South Conference tournament title, giving her 66 this season (with 142 points) heading into the NCAA Division II playoffs. Gregg has tallied in all 18 games she's played for CBU. The Lady Bucs (19-0-0) scored an NCAA-record 152 goals in 2001.

- Massachusetts tied a school record set in 1932 when the Minutemen won nine straight games. Led by Atlantic-10 Offensive Player of the Year **Jeff Deren**, UMass went unbeaten in October.

- Senior striker **Cindy Rainville**, who owns South Alabama's career goals (45), assists (30) and points (120) records, will be the last Jaguar wearing No. 2. Her number was retired.

- **Tim Lenahan**'s first season as Northwestern men's head coach was filled with frustration. The Wildcats lost to Penn State, 2-0, in the first round of the Big Ten tournament to finish 0-13-3. Still, it was an improvement on their 0-17-1 season in 2000. Northwestern will enter the 2001 season with a 35-game winless streak.
