MEN'S FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Jarett Park • Syracuse

Park tied Saint Louis star Brad Davis for the national lead in assists with 14 in 15 games — a figure that ranks second on the Orangemen's single-season record books. Park also tallied five goals, putting him sixth in the Big East in points with 24. He also will play lacrosse for the Orangemen, following in the footsteps of his grandfather, Everett Park, who played soccer and lacrosse for SU in 1946-47.

Christine Sinclair • Portland

College soccer was expected to be a step down for the Pilot striker, who — before arriving in Portland — had scored 20 goals in 24 matches for Canada's national team. Sinclair was dominant as anticipated, third in NCAA Division I scoring (23 goals, 8 assists) with a knack for netting the huge goals. Nearly half her total pulled the Pilots even or ahead, and a late surge — 16 in the final 12 games — led them to the College Cup.
