



EDEY WON THE CUP

AT THE WESTMINSTER KENNEL CLUB SHOOT.

A Surprise to the Older Pigeon Shots—McAlpin Was the Only One Near Him—Thirty-four Entries in This Event.

The New Year's shoot of the Westminster Kennel Club at Babylon, L. I., was a big event with lovers of pigeon shooting. The contest was open only to members of the Westminster Kennel Club, Westchester County; Larchmont, Philadelphia; Carteret, Texedo, Riverton, and Morristown clubs. Nearly every one of the clubs mentioned had representatives and the club house and grounds were well filled with sportsmen.

The conditions for the big handicap were shooters at 29 yards and back, miss and out; at 28 and 27 yards, two misses out and at 26 yards and under three misses out.

Harry Edey captured the handsome trophy. Shooting from the 27-yard mark he missed his 16th bird, but graced the remainder of his string in excellent style without a break. G. S. McAlpin (31 yards) gave him a close race for the honors and but for a miss at his last bird, that soared away without having a feather ruffled, would have scored a clean string of kills.

At the end of the 10th round it was agreed to divide the \$740 prize money among the five who were then in the lead. The lucky ones were Messrs. Edey, McAlpin, Colonel Butler (27 yards), E. Toland (28 yards) and Edgar Murphy (31 yards). The shooting then continued for the possession of the cup, Edey eventually winning.

A PRACTICE SHOOT

Held on the Grounds of the Keystone Shooting League.

Several members of the Keystone Shooting League, of Philadelphia, met for practice on their grounds, at Holmesburg Junction, on New Year's day. There were four events shot, one of which was under expert rules. This was won by W. H. Wolstencroft, the champion shot under these rules for New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. SHOT IN FINE FORM.

Landis and Thurman Found the Birds at Reading.

A live bird tournament at Reading, Pa., on Dec. 29 drew out a number of good pigeon shots and some splendid shooting was done. H. Landis and Harry Thurman, of the Keystone Shooting League, Philadelphia, were present and won most of the money. Thurman was using his Smith gun and King's smokeless powder and succeeded in killing 45 out of 46 birds from five traps, 30 rise yards rise. He shot in a double bird event and succeeded in making a couple of Dutch doubles. Landis, using Hazard's smokeless, lost but one bird in 35 shot at, except in a double bird match, where he allowed three birds to escape in four pair shot at. Coldren, of Reading, shot in good form and lost but two birds in 27 shot at. Shaaber, of Reading, lost but two birds in the first 30, but fell down to six in the last 10 birds shot at. The birds were a fair lot flyers, some very good ones and a few slow ones.
