victory for Winchester factory-loaded "Leader" shells. The Gilman & Barnes trophy, emblematic of the international championship at live birds, was won by R. R. Bennett, of Pittsburg, Pa., with the score of 24 out of 25 birds from the 30-yard mark. Alec Tolsma won high average for the first day at targets with a score of 176 out of 200, and Charles Spencer won high average for the second day at live birds with a score of 25 straight. This was certainly remarkable shooting under the circumstances. At the shoot at Bound Brook, N.
