The Monongahela Valley Sportsmen's League Hold a Tournament.

Va., May 15—Editor "Sporting Life."—The Monongahela Valley Sportsmen's League of West Virginia held its second regular monthly tournament on the grounds of the Fairmont Gun Club, May 9, and the Club continued the programme May 10, a two-day tournament during which 47 sportsmen faced the traps and about 12,000 targets were trapped from one Leggett and one Dickey trap.
