ON THE PACIFIC COAST.

Dr. Slade Made a Clean Score on Live Birds.

San Francisco, Cal., Aug. 18.—The sixth monthly live-bird shoot of the season was held at the Ingleside trap-shooting grounds Aug. 13, under the direction of the California Wing Club. A large and enthusiastic gathering of members was present to participate in the grassing of feathers as the end of the term for trap-shooting is drawing to a close.

The race was twenty birds, which even tested the shooting abilities of the respective contestants. Naturally, considerable interest was manifested in the contest and this interest became very pronounced when the oldest member of the club, Dr. "Slade," led all of his competitors after Clarence Haight had lost his seventeenth bird, which dropped dead out of bounds. There was loud cheering and spirited congratulations extended to the pioneer sportsman when he grassed his last bird and retired with the only clean score made in the regular event.

Dr. "Slade" has been shooting twenty-three years with the California Wing Club, and is to-day considered not only a good trap shot, but one of the best field shots in the State. The second oldest member of the club is Peter Walsh, who shot in splendid form and won the club's handsome trophy by defeating all contestants for the cup race. Of the thirty-five birds that Walsh shot at in the two events he had only two birds scored against him, one of which he missed and the other hit extremely hard, dropped dead just over the boundary fence; both misses were made in the regular club event.

In the cup race on 15 birds Pete Walsh won on 15 straight kills. Dr. McConnell, Haight, Feudner and Schultz were a close second with one miss each. The scores follow:

Richmond, Va., Aug. 25.—The longest and decidedly the most enthusiastic regular shoot ever pulled off on the grounds of the Richmond Gun Club took place August 19. The principal attractions were a \$5 Sunday ticket, a \$5 umbrella, \$2 in cash, 20 Lefever gun cleaners and a case of beer. Twenty-two shooters faced the traps in the regular score and twenty-one entered for the merchandise prizes, which was at 50 targets, with handicap allowed all shooters under \$2 per cent.

Mr. Fultz, with a score on 4, tied Mr. Coleman with same score, with a handicap, and took first and second prizes—\$5 umbrella and \$5 laundry ticket.

Mr. Rufus Baker, with handicap allowance, won the \$2 in cash. The sixteen gun cleaners were divided among the next list of shooters.

The shooting of Anderson and Brown in the last string of 25 was remarkable, as it was so dark the referee could scarcely

discern when the targets were broken. Each broke 23 out of last 25.

In the regular first 50 "Pigeon John" and MacLelland tied for high gun, "P. J." finally winning out. MacLelland put up a good score on a wager of 100 to 25 that he could not break straight. He centered target after target and won out amid the applause of the entire club.
