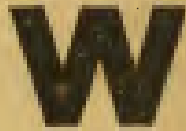

They had a very pleasant afternoon's shoot, most of them shooting at the 200 targets. Birkland finished up with 175 ex 200, which landed him in first place, Heath getting second place with 171 ex 200, and Antoine broke 170 ex 200. Antoine had two 24s to his credit, Heath and Birkland each accounting for one of the same number. We hope to have them with us more often in the future, and we would especially like to see Dr. and Mrs. Carson among our regulars again, as they are two of the old-time favorites. Wednesday, April 6 Mr. L. M. Fetherston and Mrs. Fetherston came out to the park to try out Mrs. Fetherston's new gun, which had just arrived from the factory that same morning. She broke 36 out of 75 at singles and then shot at 12 pairs, of which she broke 7, this being the first time she had ever shot at doubles. Mr. Fetherston then took a turn and broke 20 ex 25. Scores:
