SLOAN'S SHOOTING.

Does the Best Work in a Field of Twenty-Eight Marksmen, and Scores Four Points For Independent Club's Trophy.

Philadelphia, Pa., July 11.—Twenty-eight gunners braved the heat of Old Sol and also the heated barrels of their guns to participate in the monthly shoot of the Independent Gun Club, which was shot Saturday afternoon at Holmesburg Junction. With little wind to play pranks with the targets. They offered a shining mark for the men at the traps and a majority finished the day's work with creditable scores. The shoot was a combined one, inasmuch as beside the spoons offered by the club for the monthly scores as high man, runner-up, class shooting, etc., it was also the second competition in the race for the Eames trophy, which is to be shot for during the summer months. Points will decide the winner of this valuable emblem, the points being awarded for each shoot being four for high man, three for second high, two for third and one for fourth. Saturday there was a bitter race to gain those four points, but Sloan, who proved to be the winner of the club's spoon offered for the gunner with the best score, with 94 smashes, also was credited with four points on the Eames trophy. Including handicap of seven, which carried him above the 100 mark, Sloan was the only gunner to reach and pass the century mark. Boyer, who tailed just 99, captured the spoon offered for the runner-up score, and he also was given credit for three points of the trophy. Jones and Griffith, with scores of 98 each, got two points on the Eames prize, while Cantrell, with 97, landed the lone tally for fourth high score. SOUTH END OPENS GROUNDS.

Reading Gun Club Holds Fine Tourney Over New Traps.

Reading, Pa., July 8.—In all 20 marksmen took part in the tournament of the South End Gun Club on July 4, which marked the opening of the new grounds at Carsonia Park. After having been for 23 years on Boyer's Island, where it held some great shooting tourneys, the grounds at Carsonia Park were leased as affording greater opportunity for enjoying the sport. What particularly pleased the members when they reached the grounds, and the unattached shooters also, was the pretty new club house. This was built after a design worked out by Peter Texter, one of the charter members, and is built in sections. It is ample to accommodate the members and a goodly number of guests, and, as the front is of glass, opportunity is afforded persons on the inside seeing what is going on at the traps in the coldest and most inclement weather. To mark the dedication of the new grounds, ten events were pulled off, each of 25 targets. Adams was high man for the day with an average of 92.80. That the shooting was of good quality throughout can be seen from the general average, which was
