Mrs. Taggart says she is going to be one of our Sunday regulars and is going to learn to shoot or know the reason why. Her scores were not quite up to what she is capable of.

Byrne was going along at a fine clip, landing on top with 97 x 100 in the regular club event. Graham came next in line with 95, Shaw crowding him with 94, and Thomas and Fetherstone each breaking 91.

We had a splendid day for shooting, as it cooled off a little from what we had the last few days, and we expected to see a good big turnout of shooters, but it looks as if vacation trips are now in order and consequently it cuts down our attendance.

Byrne concluded it was about time for him to quit experimenting and get down to business, and as a result he put up a fine score, and when he gets the stock on that new gun just where he wants it he will make the best of them hustle to follow his pace.

Winners of the first division of the Summer series are as follows, five best scores to count: First, L. M. Fetherstone, 487 x 500; second, J. A. Taggart, 482 x 500; third, C. Johnston, 481 x 500; fourth, D. E. Thomas, 479 x 500; fifth, W. F. De Wolf, 478 x 500.

No one was more surprised than Fetherstone himself when he found that he had won a handsome leather hunter's and fisherman's hand bag, the detachable bottom being a complete tackle box with many compartments and two raising shelves. These can all be taken out and it can then be used for carrying shells. This was one of the five special prizes given the winners of the five highest scores in first division of the Summer series of shoots, which is divided into three divisions.

The attention of all those present was centered on a very interesting race between Albert and George Quade, the 14 and 17-year-old sons of H. Quade. This is the fourth time they have shot at the traps and they took their turns on the firing line and handled their guns as if they were old hands at the game. They shot in good time and centered most all of their breaks in fine shape. Al landing 81 x 100 against 70 x 100, which George broke.
