Philadelphia, Pa., August 22.—Breaking 100 straight at targets, Oliver established a record for the Clearview Gun Club in the monthly shoot held Saturday, August 20, at Darby. Oliver broke every target he shot at, and it was the first time a straight century has ever been reached on the Darby grounds. He broke 25 in the club event, which was at 25 targets, and in the other events he smashed 75 targets. His shooting was the feature of the afternoon. Fisher was a close runner-up to Oliver, in the Class A prize event, he breaking 24, while Vogelthree, McCullough and Peltz all reached the 33 mark.
