Of the Special Trophy Offered by the S. S. White Gun Club.

Philadelphia, Pa., November 15.—Jesse Griffith is the possessor of the Thomas Nelson trophy, which was offered to the S. S. White Gun Club for competition in September, October and November. Griffith shot consistently throughout the three months and was enabled to capture the prize by a total of 288 breaks out of a possible 300 targets. In the September shoot he broke 97 of his century of targets. He improved this mark by two in the October shoot by breaking 99, while last Saturday, in the final shoot, he smashed 92. The conditions were 100 targets per month, with handicaps added to the scores. Walter Firth gave Griffith a close run for the trophy, finishing seven behind the winner. Cantrell,

GRIFFITHS WINS SHOOT.

Overcomes Firth's Handicap at Independent—S. S. White's Event.

Philadelphia, Pa., November 18.—Jesse Griffiths nosed out Walter Firth in an exciting brush for the high gun prize offered by the Independent Gun Club's monthly shoot at Holmesburg Junction on November 12. Firth, who shot a few squads ahead of Griffiths, looked like a winner when he had finished his round of 100 targets, for he had a total of 93, having smashed 73 of his 100 birds and being boosted in the 90 class by a liberal handicap of 20. Griffiths, however, by consistent shooting, swept through his four rounds with high score, and by breaking 24 out of the final 25, in the face of a heavy wind, he totaled 92 breaks. Having a handicap of two was just enough to enable him to beat out Firth. Pratt won the A dipper, Fontaine carried home the B trophy, and Puff stuck the C donation in his pocket. Griffiths' 92 was the best actual score, while Skelly, of Wilmington, totaled 88, Newcomb broke 87 and Worthington 86. In connection with the Independent shoot the S. S. Whites shot their monthly tests on the same grounds. J. F. Pratt won the club event, breaking 20 of his 24 birds, which with a handicap of seven easily carried him to the top. W. E. Robinson and Pratt tied for the spoon offered for the high score on the two events with a total of 55, but as the club rules prohibit any gunner from winning two spoons on any single day Robinson was awarded the trophy.
