The Philadelphia Trap Shooters Arrange Schedule for Season's Events.

By Thomas D. Richter. Philadelphia, Pa., November 28.—A five-club circuit of the strongest target organizations in the East will make up the Philadelphia Trap Shooters' League this year. Although the Florists, at one time the leading target club in the country, has withdrawn from the league, owing to lack of interest shown by the members in the shoots, the organization this year is well balanced and as strong as in past seasons. Most of the active members of the Wissinoming Club have joined the other clubs, and this will keep the calibre of the league up to the highest notch, for it will not lose a first-class gunner by the Florists dropping out of the game. The five clubs which will battle for the championship this season and the many trophies offered are Highland, S. S. White, Meadow Spring and the two Jersey clubs, Haddonfield and South End, of Camden. The season opens next Saturday at Haddonfield and Edge Hill, and until May the clubs will shoot once a month. The same conditions as heretofore will govern the shoots—50 targets per man, with the 10 highest scores to count for the team's total.
