Incidentally, the visitors from the Schuylkill captured three trophies, one for the match, one going to Jensen for being high net on the day's program, and another being a tie between Cochrane and Sharer, both members of the Midvale Club. Had it not been for Albion Moulton the Fox members would have fared pretty poorly, but Moulton ran away with two dippers by being the best gun when the totals were made up, and his score was high in the club handicap. The Midvale Gun Club has been shooting since 1909, at Kitchen's Lane, and had a membership of 66. The club numbers several shooters of merit among the members, and the club was in a flourishing condition until the grounds were sold, and it was resolved to dissolve, and allow the members to cast their fortunes with others of the local shooting clubs. ### BOSTON A. A. IN CLUB SHOOT

Five Men Win Trophies Despite Hard Shooting Conditions.

Boston, Mass., February 2.—The Boston A. A. held its weekly shoot and a special match in a heavy rain and gale on January 31. Despite conditions that were the worst possible for sport, some good scores were made. To make matters worse for S. Ellis and G. Clark the scorer told them at the end of the weekly shoot that they were tied. They did not flinch, though the rain was still coming down in torrents, but went out and shot at 25 targets which Clark won. The latter was then told that the scorer had added the first scores wrong and that Clark had won the first time. The scratch trophy was captured by F. Williams, who broke 97 targets from scratch. To keep in touch with the weather a special rain match for a cup was shot for at 50 targets. It was won by W. C. Brooks. The January cup was awarded to F. H. Richards, who scored 150, the total of the three best scores made this month. The second prize was awarded to M. Ballou, who scored 149. The two months' cup was won by C. F. Marden, who scored 584 in six of the 11 shoots held in December and January. S. A. Ellis was given second prize, he having scored 578. During the afternoon Williams, Davis, Snow, Adams and Tucker challenged any other five men in the club to a 100-target team match to be shot next Saturday.
