

100 Targets Straight Wins Colorado State Amateur Championship

IT'S seldom that an event of 100 targets is won with a straight score, but James Higgins, who won the Colorado Interstate Amateur Championship, did it. He had to do it to win, for Norris Eads, who was second, scored 99. After Eads came three men, R. A. King, J. H. Rohrer and C. D. Plank, with 98. Mr. Higgins shot Winchester Shells, and the other four gentlemen shot Winchester Repeating Shotguns. This was some shooting, and it takes "some" guns and "some" shells to do such shooting.

There is more to come, however. The Rocky Mountain Interstate Handicap was also won with Winchester shells and a Winchester Repeating shotgun in the hands of A. W. Huff, who scored 94 x 100. The High Average for 16 yard targets and the High Average for all targets were also won with Winchester shells and a Winchester Repeating shotgun in the hands of R. A. King. His scores were 393 x 400 and 516 x 550. A feature of this tournament was the many long runs, James Higgins making 173, R. A. King 134, J. H. Rohrer 121, Norris Eads 114, W. R. Thomas 101; the last four all shooting Winchester shells and guns and Higgins shooting Winchester shells.

Winchester Guns and Shells were also very busy at other big shoots. Winchester shells were used by J. N. Knox, who won the Interstate Championship of Ohio with the almost

perfect score of 99 x 100; and they were also used by H. E. Smith, who won High Amateur Average at this shoot with 430 x 450.

Another State Amateur Championship won with Winchester shells was that of Louisiana, J. T. Austin running ahead of the bunch with the high total of 98 x 100. The Louisiana Handicap, the other important event at this shoot, was won by A. H. Campbell with a score of 96 x 100, and 25 straight on the shoot-off. He shot a Winchester Repeating shotgun.

Winchester Shells also pulled down the State Championship of West Virginia, being used in the gun of John Lallance, who topped all contestants with the fine score of 96 x 100.

With the same score, Winchester shells won the Interstate Association Championship, being used by W. A. Wiederbusch. The Two-Man State Championship was also gathered with them, both E. H. Taylor and W. A. Wiederbusch, who shot them, scoring 50 straight.

WINCHESTER Shells and Guns Eliminate "Chances"

COLORADO STATE TOURNEY

James Higgins Lands Amateur Championship With 100 Straight.

Colorado Springs, Colo., June 12.—The fourth annual State championship trap shooting tournament of the Rocky Mountain Interstate Sportsman's Association, on June 1, 2, 3, has passed into history as one of the most successful meets ever held by this organization. From a point of attendance the shoot was somewhat disappointing to the management, but the embargo against shipping ammunition or guns into the State and the recent coal strike all had their effect. The Interstate Association's amateur State championship was won by James Higgins, of La Junta, who broke 100 straight in this event on the second day. Norris Eads was second with 99. To C. F. Nelson went the State double championship with 44 out of 50. R. A. King took the high amateur average with 393 out of 400. J. H. Rohrer finished second with 390, and C. A. Gunning third with 383. King, also led on all targets with 516 out of 550. He also won the Spaulding State championship medal with 93. Arthur Huff, of Victor, captured the Rocky Mountain Handicap with 94 from 22 yards. Professional honors fell to H. C. Keefe, who smashed 378 out of 400, and 506 out of 550 on the whole program. The shooting grounds were put in superb condition by John Garrett, whose long experience and detail work leaves him without an equal in the West. Three sets of traps were in perfect working condition and looked after during the shoot by L. P. Lawton.

LOUISIANA STATE SHOOT

J. T. Austin Captures Interstate Championship and G. Macmurdo the Average.

Monroe, La., June 11.—The annual Louisiana State trap shooting tourney was decided over the traps of the Monroe Gun Club on June 5 and 6, with an attendance of almost a half hundred. The State trap shooting championship, carrying the Interstate Association title, fell to J. T. Austin, of Monroe, president of the Monroe Gun Club, who broke 98 out of 100 targets. Other winners in the State championship shoot were Morgan George, Monroe, second, 96; H. O. Warren, Ruston, and R. W. Dodd, Shreveport, third, 94; R. L. Rischer, Monroe, fourth, 93; T. F. McCaleb, Monroe, and Guy Macmurdo, New Orleans, fifth, 92. The State Handicap championship resulted in a tie between J. R. Livingstone and A. H. Campbell, each breaking 96 out of 100, the former shooting from the 20-yard mark. In the shoot-off Livingstone won with 25 to 23. The amateur average honors were taken by W. H. Hodges, Tyler, Texas, who broke 478 out of 500, the second men being
