A. HURR WINS AMATEUR TITLE

Illinois Shot Lands Simon Pure 88 Per Cent. Championship.

Kansas City, Mo., October 2.—With a score of 90 out of a possible 100 targets, A. S. Hurr, of Oneida, Ills., won the \$100 Elliott gold medal for the Simon pure 88 per cent. amateur championship, at Elliott's Blue River Park, recently. Hurr and T. H. Chitwood, of Oswego, Kan., were tied at the close of the regular program and in the shoot-off Hurr won out. The tournament was the most successful since the first Simon pure event was given several years ago. The ideal weather was favorable for good scores, the best being made on the final day when the gold medal was the prize. Bob Elliott, of Kansas City, who was high gun the first day, led the entire field of amateurs for the three days with a grand total of 435 out of a possible 500. L. E. Wilson, of Emporia, Kan., was second with 433, and J. J. Randall, of Greensburg, Kan., was third with 432. G. G. Greenlee, of Chapman, Kan.; A. S. Hurr, of Oneida, Ills., and Dan Dahlene, of Lawrence, Kan., were tied for fourth place with 429 each. Charley Spencer did some fine shooting among the professionals taking part in the tournament, merely as exhibition shooters. He made a score of 483 out of a possible 500. Barstow and Gross were tied for second high professional with 462 each. Killam was fourth with 460, and Bovee was fifth with 458. Scores:

PHILA. LEAGUE HISTORY

Eight Contestants Start Eleventh Campaign of Organization.

The Philadelphia Trap Shooters' League, an organization that has been a prime factor in developing trap shooting in Southeastern Pennsylvania and surrounding States, starts on its eleventh campaign on October 10, with a circuit of eight strong clubs. From that time until April 3, contests will be held monthly, seven in number, to decide the championship. The contestants this year will be the champion Du Pont Club, of Wilmington; S. S. White, Highland, Clearview, Glen Willow and Meadow Springs, of Philadelphia; Lansdale Club, of Lansdale, Pa., and the Camden, N. J., Shooting Association. Shooting conditions are the same as in previous years, each club being represented by as many shots as desired, the shooting being at 50 targets per man, and ten high scores counting for each team. In the ten years of campaigns already decided, four clubs have won all the championships. Florists, now out of existence, won three times, as did S. S. White, while Highland and Du Pont have won twice. The complete record of the league from its start, follows:
