Seventy-one Compete in Old Home Week Trap Contests.

Wilmington, Del., October 19.—Seventy-one shooters competed in the Du Pont Trap Shooting Club's Old Home Week shoot, on October 17, for the fine trophies offered. High amateur honors were divided between W. G. Wood and W. M. Foord, both breaking 93 out of 100, excellent scoring under hard conditions. J. B. McHugh and Harry Eyre tied for second with 92. T. C. Martin and Harry Cook finished with 91. Lester German led the professionals with 96. Foord won Class A prize when he beat Wood on the shoot-off of the tie at 93, with 20 to 17. In Class B, Jesse Griffith was high with 86, S. M. Crothers and Fred Plum following. Clyde Leedom and T. W. Mathewson tied in Class C and Leedom won on the toss. In Class D, Dr. Arthur Patterson was high and Dave Lindsay in Class E. The double event went to A. B. Richardson with 17.
