TRAP SHOOTING AT ST. LOUIS

Matches at O'Fallon, Central and Alta Sita Clubs Draw Crowds.

St. Louis, Mo., October 23.—Another very successful trap shooting event took place last Sunday at the Central Gun Club. Several big shoots have been held by the various clubs around St. Louis this season, and not to be outdone, the members of the Central Gun Club put forth every effort to make the annual merchandise shoot a large affair and the result was that 63 shooters entered for the day's program. It was an ideal day and with a good regulation white flyer target to shoot at the scores recorded were very good. Peter Baggerman came back to life and displayed his old-time form, breaking 100 straight targets; never before has this score been made over these traps by an amateur. At the beginning of the 1914 season the club voted \$25 in cash to any amateur breaking 100 straight at any regular shoot, and Baggerman turned the trick just in time as this was the next to the last shoot of the year. Bart Lewis, of Auburn, Ills., was second high with 97x100. Joseph Locatell, of the M. A. A. Gun Club, and E. J. Linde, of O'Fallon, Ills., tied for third place with 95x100. Bart Williams, of St. Louis, scored 93x100, being tied with N. R. Huff, of East St. Louis and Mayor J. D. Mollman, of Mascoutah, Ills. BIG FIELD IN OVERLAND SHOOT

C. H. Newcomb Wins Honors From A. B. Richardson on the Shoot-Off.

Philadelphia, Pa., October 26.—Tying at 94 out of 100, Charles H. Newcomb, of this city, and A. B. Richardson, champion of Delaware, shot off the tie at the third annual Overland, tournament at Highland Gun Club, on October 24, Newcomb winning with 23 out of 25, to 22 for Richardson. W. B. Severn ranked third with 93. Miss E. Hammond won the women's event with 43½, beating Mrs. White by a half point. In the different classes the high men shot off an extra round of 25. In Class A, Newcomb totaled 23 against Richardson's 22. In Class B, Izzy Hoffman was defeated by one point by Dixon, who turned in a score of 23. In Class C, Pennington, from Media, totaled 22 targets, as against 18 for J. Greenwood, of this city. In Class D, the two contestants, R. Greenwood and Hitchcock, left before they could be notified and they will shoot off for the trophy at some future event. J.
