F. STOTT'S TWO-DAY SHOOT

Nelson Long and H. O. Loane Divide Honors in Big Field.

Essex, Ont., December 4.—Frank Stotts, the noted Essex sportsman, gave his third annual two-days' tournament on December 1 and 2 that attracted a big field, including some of the best shots in Canada. The premier honors went to Nelson Long, of Hamilton, who won the Aberdeen Handicap at white flyers with 15 straight and four in the miss-and-out shoot-off of the tie. He took \$50 and a beautiful gold watch for his trouble. Nelson also led the first day on targets with 98 out of 100. The target average for two days fell to H. O. Loane, of Chatham, who broke 284 out of 300. Fred Kerr, of Crediton, broke 281 and finished second.
