

Editorial Preface

The previous edition of *Sporting Traditions* was a most significant volume because it provided a number of prominent scholars of sports history an opportunity to present their views on the current state of the field. It also provided the rest of us with an easily accessible source of current debate on that topic. It was a fitting testament to the work done by Douglas Booth and Annemarie Jutel in hosting the Queenstown conference and acting as guest editors of the volume.
