## ***ASSH STUDENT ESSAY AND DISSERTATION PRIZES***

ASSH offers two prizes annually for quality work by tertiary or secondary students in the general field of sports culture. Appropriate areas of focus are: sport and economics, sport in history, law, literature, philosophy, politics, social psychology and sociology. Sports culture and tradition should be seen as being broad not confined.

The ASSH Dissertation Prize will be awarded to an Honours Thesis written in 2000. One (returnable) copy should be submitted. The prize is \$200 and a one year subscription to ASSH. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the judging panel. The winning dissertations may be published in an ASSH Study in Sports History.

The ASSH Essay Prize will be awarded to an essay written in 2000. Two copies should be submitted. The prize is \$200 and a one year subscription to ASSH. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the judging panel. The winning dissertations may be published in the ASSH Bulletin.
