

Notes on Contributors

Steve Bailey is a Housemaster at Winchester College, UK, where he has taught for 22 years having served for 10 years as Director of Physical Education. He teaches History and Physical Education and has written and edited a number of books, mainly on the subjects of Olympism, Physical Education and Sports History. He is an Honorary Research Fellow of De Montfort University and also of the University of Strathclyde. Steve has served as a Member of the Editorial Board of ICSSPE, and the *International Journal of Volleyball Research*, and as a Member of the Executive Committee of the Physical Education Association of the UK. He has been commissioned by the IOC to write the official history of the Paralympic Movement.

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Russell Hoye teaches sport management, leisure management and sport planning and development in the School of Leisure Studies at Griffith University, Brisbane. His research interests include the governance of sporting organisations, the use of power in managing sporting organisations and the management of volunteers in sport.

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Ian Jobling is an Associate Professor in the School of Human Movement Studies and Director of the Centre for Olympic Studies at The University of Queensland. He has held a range of positions on boards of bodies concerned with the study of the Olympics and Olympism, and has linked his research interests in the socio-cultural aspects of sport, especially the Olympic movement, with Olympic Education. He was the inaugural Honorary Regional Director in Australia / Oceania of the International Council for Sports Science and Physical Education (ICSSPE), the organisation which developed roots during the International Congress on Physical Education, held prior to the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne.

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Richard Light lectures in physical education at The University of Melbourne. He spent six years coaching rugby at university and high school level in Japan and completed a comparative study on high school rugby in Australia and Japan for his PhD. He has since published widely on the social dimensions of sport in Japan with a focus on the body, culture and learning within educational institutions. He has recent publications in English and Japanese on rugby, soccer and sumo

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Tara Magdalinski is a Senior Lecturer in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at the University of the Sunshine Coast.. She has published widely in the area of sports studies focussing most recently on the cultural construction of performance enhancement.
